| 3 | Science | Life and physical sciences approved for college admission requirements, including one life science course meeting the standards for Biology I, one of physical science meeting the standards for Physical Science, Chemistry or Physics; and one from the domains of physical science, life science, or earth/space science, or approved full-time postsecondary career and technology program or approved science course with content and/or rigor above Biology I or Physical Science |
| 3 | Social Studies | One unit of American History, ½ credit of Oklahoma History, ½ credit of United States Government, and one credit from Native American History, Advanced Placement Government, World History, or other approved subject in the field of social studies |
| 6 | Student's ICAP Career Pathway | Courses which align to the student's Individual Career and Academic Plan (ICAP) and may include, but are not limited to, any additional math, science, English, history, world or non-English language, computer technology, career and technology education courses, concurrently enrolled courses, advanced placement courses, music, drama, speech, media arts, athletics, or other approved courses |
